

# ARIZONA

## THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED BY LAW.

(A.R.S. § 17-255; R12-4-1102)

Lake Powell is quagga-infested. Before leaving the vicinity you must:

### CLEAN & DRY

Remove all mud, plants and mussels from your boat. This includes hull, anchor & chain/lines, stern attachments, engine, trailer, etc. Allow your boat and equipment to dry to the best extent possible before transporting.

### REMOVE PLUG & DRAIN

Completely drain all water from bilge, live wells, ballast tanks and other compartments. If applicable, drain water from lower engine unit.

**IF WATERCRAFT WAS ON LAKE POWELL FOR SIX OR MORE DAYS, YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ABOVE STEPS, THEN ADDITIONALLY:**

### DECONTAMINATE & DESICCATE

Watercraft owners/transporters are responsible for having their boats and equipment decontaminated prior to leaving the vicinity. Before launching on another waterbody or transporting to another state, you must also desiccate your boat and equipment for 18 consecutive days from November through April or 7 consecutive days from May through October.

## IT'S THE LAW!

### Before leaving Lake Powell:

- **INSPECT** the interior and exterior of your boat—including equipment, such as trailer, engine, anchor lines, recreational gear and other surfaces contacting lake water—for the presence of mussels, shelled organisms, vegetation or mud.
- **CLEAN** all vegetation and mud from your boat and equipment.
- **DRAIN** all lake water from your boat, including the bilge, live well, ballast tank, lower engine unit and any other compartment that may hold lake water.

**IMPORTANT:** You must contact the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources (1-800-662-3337) to receive authorization *before* leaving Lake Powell **if** you:

- find mussels or shelled organisms attached to your boat or equipment;
- cannot clean all vegetation and mud from your boat and equipment; OR
- cannot drain all lake water from your boat and equipment.

### Before launching in other waters:

After leaving Lake Powell, you are *required by law* to decontaminate your boat and equipment before launching in another Utah water. You can decontaminate in one of two ways:

- **SELF-DECONTAMINATE** by storing and *drying* your boat and equipment for at least 7 days in summer, 18 days in spring or fall and 30 days in winter.
- **PROFESSIONALLY DECONTAMINATE** by using a professional decontamination service approved by the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources that completely washes and flushes your boat and equipment with 140-degree F water.
